'Employability and internationalisation: student satisfaction, institutional models and alternative providers'

In partnership with IEAA, on 9 July the Observatory on Borderless Higher Education will be hosting a one-day event in Melbourne focusing on employability and internationalisation.

A premise for study abroad has long been enhanced student employability; however, as the number of mobile students continue to grow, what do we know about the employment impact of international study?

Universities worldwide are under pressure to connect degree-level study and employability through the curriculum, work experience and enhanced reporting. To what extent does international experience feature in these efforts?

In response to the perceived need for a return on investment, alternative providers have emerged seeking to complement or compete with conventional degrees in terms of enhanced employability. What exactly are the alternative providers offering, and what is the balance between collaboration and competition with conventional universities?

Join us on 9 July when we will explore trends on the above themes, examine the nature of the evidence, and sketch out directions for future research.
